PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This year has been filled with remarkable achievements, growth, and an unwavering commitment to our mission of beach safety, community engagement, and fostering a vibrant surf culture.

I want to thank all our members, volunteers, sponsors, and supporters for their exceptional contributions throughout the year.

Membership and Volunteer Engagement

Our club has continued to thrive, experiencing growth across our membership, particularly in our patrolling and junior development categories. Our patrolling members also delivered a record-high level of 100% Patrol Efficiency for our club. The commitment and enthusiasm demonstrated by our members have been truly outstanding.

This year, our members conducted 43 rescues, responded to 454 first aid situations, and took over 1,942 preventative actions during patrol hours to protect our community and beachgoers. We also reinforced our commitment to surf education and training, with members completing 288 new lifesaving qualifications, including 90+ members receiving their first lifesaving award.

DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Management of Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated, I present to you the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 30 April 2025.

Continuing the theme from previous years, our club remains in a strong financial position, but this year reports a small deficit for the year of \$13,247 (2024 surplus of \$6,318). Our cash movement however, which exclude non-cash items, such as depreciation and other fixed asset adjustments, showed a strong surplus of \$63,898 (2024 \$28,543)

After 23/24's inflationary increase to fees, we did freeze the fees for 24/25 and we received a one-off subsidy from SLS NSW which allowed us to discount membership fees by half for patrolling members. A further freeze has now been agreed for season 25/26, albeit a return to the prices without the subsidy. This freeze was considered appropriate as a result of the ongoing economy generally taking its toll on the public.

Our income for the year was \$491,948 (2024 \$567,712). Whilst club operation has remained strong, we did not host either the major branch carnivals or the Iron Series, which contributed greatly to that decrease. This should reverse for the upcoming season where we are hopeful of the return of major events..

The make-up of donations, sponsorship and grant funding has again changed during the year, with Bendigo joining us as an IRB sponsor / grant provider. We have continued to refresh the advertising board on the promenade this year, and found further businesses who are now contributing to that platform. We of course continue to look for more.

As with last year, operating expenses were again higher, with the ongoing issue of general inflation and increased prices joining the ongoing activity. As usual we were well represented at the Australian Championships, and we supported those athletes with competitor subsidy to assist in mitigating their travel and accommodation costs incurred in representing our club. Additionally, we have continued our spending on lifesaving clothing. The costs of maintaining the utilities within our aging building continue to increase. Whilst the progress on the redevelopment of the club continues, no further monetary costs were incurred

this year, despite the large time commitment made by many members of the various committees and general membership.

Depreciation charges were again higher this year due to investment in new equipment at \$109,935 (2024 \$106,252).

We also continued to invest in our members, with education, training and awards all being run for both junior and senior members, with the highest number of nippers signed up for many years.

Due again to the strong financial management and prudence of the past management of the Club, we continue to be able to move forward with the club's operations with confidence, despite the likely upheaval of the redevelopment, and embrace the changes as they unfold.

We also acknowledge that the financial position could not have been achieved without the support of:

- Our major sponsors, Maroubra Seals Sports and Community Club, NSW Ports, and Suttons Isuzu Ute Arncliffe
- Bendigo Bank for its new support
- Randwick City Council for its continued support, both financially and on a practical side, with grant funding and logistical assistance on many levels, and its ongoing support and major time investment in the club's redevelopment commitment.
- Our local licensed clubs for their support via the ClubGrant scheme, particularly Maroubra Seals and Community Club, and South Sydney Juniors Rugby League Club

Please note that there are no entries required to be reflected in the Financial Statements in respect of any testamentary bequests or Trusts or similar, this year.

On a personal note, I would like to thank the whole of the Executive Board and Finance team who have assisted me greatly again this year, including Tim Barron for his past assistance with the sponsorship project, prior to his international relocation just after the year end, and my wife, who supports behind the scenes when I am spending time dealing with my club duties.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 April 2025

1 Summary of Material Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Preparation

The members of the executive committee have prepared the financial statements on the basis that Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club is a not for profit and a nonreporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. These financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not for Profits Commission Act 2012, Associations Incorporation Act NSW 2009*, and associated regulations and the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991*.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of noncurrent assets. Cost is based on their fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The material accounting policies disclosed below are those which the Management Committee have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of members. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated.

Comparative amounts

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

b) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at historical cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. Individual items costing less than \$300 are expensed immediately through the income statement rather than capitalised on the balance sheet.

Property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful life commencing from the time the asset is held and ready for use.

Property, plant and equipment is depreciated at the following rates for each class of asset:

- Buildings	2.5%
- Improvements	10%
- Motor vehicles	10%
- Life saving equipment	25%
- Other plant and equipment	20%

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(d) Short term investments

Short-term investments consist of short term bank deposit placements made for varying periods of more than three (3) months and up to one (1) year and earn interest at the respective short-term investment rates.

(e) Income Tax

The club is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(f) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebate.

- Donations:
Are recognised at the fair value of the donations received or receivable. Donations in the form of services are measured by referring to either the fair value of the services received or the fair value of the asset or the asset enhancement resulting from the services.
- Sale of Goods:
Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised when control of the goods has passed to the buyer, the amount of revenue can be measured reliably, and it is probable that it will be received by the club.
- Interest Revenue:
Interest revenue is recognised as revenue when received.
- Member Subscriptions:
Member subscriptions are recognised over the period to which they relate.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of Goods and Services Tax (GST).

(g) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses, and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

(h) Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumption

The members of the executive committee make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below. (h) Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumption (con't)

Impairment of property, plant and equipment

The Club assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions specific to the Club that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value in use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

Qualified opinion

We have audited the financial report of Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated, which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2025, Statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in funds and statement of cash flows and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the members of the executive committee's declaration.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph

- (a) the financial report of Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club is in accordance with the *Australian Charities and Not for Profits Commission Act 2012 (ACNC Act)* and the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991*, including
 - (i) giving a true and fair view of the club's financial position as at 30 April 2025 and of its performance for the year ended on that date; and
 - (ii) complying with Australian Accounting Standards and Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 as described in Note 1,

As a result, the special purpose financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

The members of the executive committee are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 is appropriate to meet the requirements of the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991*, *Associations Incorporation Act NSW 2009* and the *Associations Incorporation Regulation 2010* and the needs of the members. CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 2024/25 patrol season at Maroubra once again showcased the strength and dedication of our volunteer patrol teams, delivering another year of dedicated service on the beach.

The season kick off mid-September provided a good opportunity to meet other patrol teams, learn more about other club activities and get ready for the season. It was encouraging to see participation from across Nippers and the Surf Sports team.

This season our patrols performed 43 rescues - 15 rescues were completed with a rescue tube, 16 with a rescue board and 9 with the support of an IRB/RWC. Our members on patrol assisted with a total of 454 First Aids and took 1942 preventative actions across 140 patrols. Members of Maroubra call out team were activated a number of times to support incidents across the branch.

We continued our commitment to the community providing water safety to local charity ocean swims (Malabar Magic), Branch Nipper Camps, Branch Carnival and the State Championships at Queenscliff.

The Lifesaving team ensures our members are well informed of their requirements to complete their proficiencies with support of the training and education team. The training and education team continues to grow from within our membership as new trainers are added and begin the mentoring process.

Patrolling members achieved a very high 100% patrol attendance record with over 170 members ensuring patrol rosters were resourced through the season.

We are grateful to the organisations that have supported our lifesaving and patrol operations throughout the season. The coastal environment presents ongoing challenges, with equipment exposed to harsh conditions that demand continual maintenance and timely upgrades to maintain readiness.

We thank Qantas, whose Side by Side program funded four new rescue boards, significantly enhancing our rescue capabilities.

We also acknowledge the valuable support of Souths Juniors, Juniors at the Junction, and the Maroubra

Seals Sports and Community Club through the ClubGRANTS program, whose recurring contributions equip our patrol and training teams with essential resources to deliver effective lifesaving and educational services.

Additionally, we appreciate the Bendigo Bank at Clovelly for their generous donation of an Inflatable Rescue Boat, addressing a critical upgrade need and supporting our operational capacity.

The continued momentum of our lifesaving and patrol operations has been made possible through the efforts of the Lifesaving Committee—Nelson, Megan, Brendan, Norm, and Joe. Their contributions have ensured that Maroubra patrols remained well-equipped and that our volunteer teams received the training necessary to perform their roles effectively.

A special thank you to the Parents and Guardians of our Cadet SRC members. Your ongoing support plays a vital role in developing future leaders on our beach and within the club.

Our Patrol Captains and Vice Captains are a steady presence on the beach, guiding patrols and actively mentoring the next generation of club leaders. Their dedication and presence has been instrumental in maintaining patrol attendance and the high standards on the beach.

LIFE SAVING REGISTRAR'S REPORT

This season saw Robert Allchin complete 20 Years continuous 100% Patrol Efficiency for Beach Patrols. This is in addition to the 10 Years continuous 100% Patrol Efficiency Award for Beach Patrols he received in 2001-2002 Season before he began his current 20 years Award. For many of those years Robert has been a Patrol Captain. A great effort.

Nelson Da Silva and Scott Morrissey completed their 10 Years continuous 100% Patrol Efficiency (Gold Medal) for Beach Patrols. Congratulations on a fine effort.

Fifteen other members achieved a Silver Medal for completing 5 Years of 100% Patrol Efficiency for Beach Patrols. Their names appear in the lists below.

A total of 176 members gained a 100% Patrol Efficiency Award for Beach Patrols for the 2024-2025 Season. Maroubra Club Members also patrolled for the Sydney Support Services with Tresne Chesher gaining a 5 years Award for ORB 30 Patrols.

Nine of our members gained a 100% Award for ORB 30 Patrols and another five members gained 100%

Award for RWC Patrols. Their names appear in lists below.

The 2024-2025 season ran from Saturday 28 September 2024 (start of the School holidays) through to Sunday 27 April 2025 (end of the School Holidays). This was a total of 70 days including all Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays. The Club provided a Patrol Team in the mornings and a fresh Patrol Team in the afternoons.

These Patrol Teams were made from 281 Active Members (15 years +) and 91 Cadet Members split into 15 Beach Patrol Teams.

These Members performed a total of 43 rescues during the season of which 15 were done with the aid of a Recue Tube, 16 with the aid of a Rescue Board and 9 by crews in the IRB. Another 1942 people were directed by Preventative Actions to avoid a rescue being needed.

DIRECTOR OF FACILITIES

Over the past 12 months, the Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club building has experienced continued and accelerating dilapidation. Critical infrastructure, including plumbing, drainage, electrical, and security systems, requires frequent and costly attention to remain operational. Compounding these issues, the building now leaks profusely during periods of rainfall, severely impacting its usability and underscoring the urgent need for redevelopment. The worsening condition of the facility reinforces the importance of progressing with the project in a timely and coordinated manner.

As of 12 June 2025, the redevelopment project has reached a significant milestone with the completion of the concept design. Following extensive consultation, the updated design was presented to the club and formally endorsed through a successful member vote held on 25 May 2025. This endorsement reflects strong internal alignment and support for the proposed design direction.

The next critical decision lies with Randwick City Council (RCC), which is scheduled to meet on 17 June 2025 to consider the club's endorsement and determine whether to approve proceeding with the concept design. Subject to Council approval, the

project will move into the Public Exhibition phase shortly thereafter.

The Public Exhibition will run for a period of four weeks and provide the community with an opportunity to review and respond to the proposed plans. Feedback received during this process will be carefully considered and used to finalise the Concept Plans, ensuring they reflect both stakeholder and community expectations.

Given the strong support received to date, the project has now progressed into the Development Application (DA) phase. This involves the preparation of detailed documentation for submission to RCC. The project team is targeting mid-October 2025 for DA lodgement, allowing sufficient time to integrate feedback from the exhibition period and meet planning requirements. RCC will then undertake its formal review and endorsement process.

This project continues to advance with clear momentum, driven by the pressing condition of the existing facility and guided by a collaborative and consultative approach.

IRB RACING REPORT

The Maroubra IRB Racing Team wrapped up last season with a strong performance at the Australian Titles held at Miami Beach on the Gold Coast. The team put in an impressive effort across both the U23 Female and Male categories. The U23 Males advanced to the semifinals, finishing 5th after a strong showing through the heats and quarterfinals. Meanwhile, the U23 Female Team reached the finals, placing 7th—marking the second consecutive year Maroubra has made the Aussies finals in this division.

A small but dedicated group travelled to Kirra Beach to represent Maroubra at the World Surf Life Saving Championships. The U23 Female Team progressed to the second round of heats, gaining valuable experience competing in the international arena.

This season, we welcomed many new members of all ages, with several experiencing IRB competition and

surf club life for the first time. Their enthusiasm and dedication have already made a positive impact.

Round 1 was hosted at Ocean Beach under sunny, ideal racing conditions. Maroubra made six finals, with standout performances from our Rookies, placing 2nd and 4th in the Rescue and Mass Rescue events. The 45+ Male Team also achieved a strong 2nd place finish, contributing vital points. The team ended the round with a total of 16 points.

Round 2 at Fingal Beach presented mixed conditions— heavy rain and wind on Day 1, followed by improved weather on Day 2. The team excelled, making ten finals and scoring 25 points—our best round of the season. Highlights included 5th-place finishes from the U23 Female Team (Tube and Mass), Rookie Mass Rescue, Rookie Rescue, and the 45+ Male Team. The U23 Male Team achieved a season-best 3rd place. Notably, our

mostly U23 Relay Team, including several first-season racers, made the finals and placed 6th—a fantastic milestone for the squad.

Round 3 took place at Avoca Beach, where rough surf conditions forced a halt to racing on Day 1. Competition resumed on Day 2 with only the Rescue events running for the Open and U23 divisions. The Open Male Team performed admirably in the challenging conditions, reaching the semifinals and finishing 5th.

Round 4 concluded the Premiership Series at Warilla Barrack Point. With ideal conditions, the team made 11 finals and earned 20 points. A standout performance came from the 45+ Male Team “Old Buoys”—who secured a Bronze medal in the overall season point score following a consistent season of racing. Maroubra closed out the Premiership Series

with a total of 61 points.

A special mention goes to all our Rookie drivers, crew, and first-time competitors. Their dedication throughout the preseason translated into impressive performances on the water. Their growth and contribution to the team have been invaluable, and we’re excited to see their development in seasons to come.

Lastly, a heartfelt thank you to our dedicated officials Mary-Jane Tier, John Georgas, Nelson Da Silva and Petrice Sullivan. Your time, support, and commitment allow our team to compete and continue to thrive. We look forward to finishing the season strong at the State Titles at Cape Hawke and the Australian Titles at South West Rocks.

Surf Sports competition remains a key development area in our program, investing considerable time and effort to develop the future athletes who will represent our club. John Georgas once again put a strong team together to run weekly training sessions for 80+ Nippers across board, beach and surf. Our Carnival attendance was on the rise and so was the number of competitors selected for Branch and State carnivals.

The March Past team delivered again and improved on last year results, with a Gold Medal as the Sydney Branch championships, and a Bronze medal at NSW State championships. Farah Messina has built a strong group of dedicated marchers who love being part of our club and the Surf Life Saving movement. It's a real pleasure seeing them perform and gain recognition for their achievements.

These highlights illustrate another season which combined plenty of learning, hard work, fun times and selfless dedication to Surf Life Saving.
